## Treasurer's Report

I'm pleased to present the audited financial statements of the MAS for the period ending 28th February 2017.

Firstly, I would like to thank Graeme Bellamy for once again auditing the societies' accounts in an efficient and professional manner, his time and help has been invaluable to me and is greatly appreciated.

Currently the society remains in a solid position with net member equity increasing to \$28,824.05, an increase over the financial year of \$2,998.32. This is a very good result for the society, being mainly driven by an increase in member numbers and fewer forest observing weekends due to bad weather.

#### Financial Performance

The main factors affecting the financial performance of 2017 against 2016 are:

- An increase in members joining MAS increase membership fees \$1197.53
- A drop off in Belanglo observing events caused by poor weather, resulting in a net improvement of \$348.18.
- An increase in donations over the year of \$97.95.
- The societies' twentieth birthday celebration one off expense in 2016 of \$848.58
- Coonabarabran trip subsidy one off expense in 2016 of \$602.80.

#### Financial Statement

The main factors affecting the financial statement of 2017 against 2016 are:

- The increased deposit into the societies' term deposit from \$19,000 to \$21,000.
- The increase of cash at bank by over the previous year of \$2,254.89.
- The write down of old stock by \$191.82.

This financial year has seen some changes for MAS, we had a modest membership fee rise to cover the increase in fees generated by our members taking advantage of MAS's credit card facilities for all types of payments. The committee is re-evaluating our fundraising as our returns are slightly diminishing due to increased costs.

The society still maintains a fixed term deposit which was increased to \$21,000.00 during the financial year. The intent is that this deposit will be maintained and increased over the next financial year to provide a strong base for future plans of the society.

Finally I would like to thank my fellow committee members and the society's members in general for your patience and support during this past year.

My procedures including examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with accounting standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Astronomical Society's financial position and the results of its operation. The Audit opinion expressed has been formed on the above basis.

The accounts have been prepared on the accruals basis, and in accordance with applicable statements of accounting concepts and accounting standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB). They have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs. The accounting policies have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

#### Note 2 - Non-Current Assets


Non-Current assets are included at cost or at independent valuation. All non-current assets are depreciated over their estimated useful life commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

## **1. OPENING OF MEETING, WELCOME & APOLOGIES**
