4.1 Treasurer's Report for March 2022

AM advised that the Annual *Statement of Financial Performance* issued in the Annual Report indicates that \$5,513.63 was received in membership fees for 2021-22 and that the operation surplus for the year was \$1,414.54. Having determined that membership fees would be waived for existing members in 2022-23 the committee should expect a very considerable operation deficit in next year's report. Noted.
